



Proctoring Options:

Students who cannot use Respondus' LockDown Browser with Monitor

Some students cannot use Respondus' LockDown Browser with Monitor to take a proctored exam. This circumstance may arise because a student is working from a Chromebook, which is not compatible with LockDown Browser, or does not own a webcam. We suggest pursuing one of the options listed below to enable these students to take proctored exams. Students can:

- [Check out Mac laptops](#) with LockDown Browser installed for a few hours from the CSU Libraries.
- If the student does not have a webcam, the instructor can set the Monitor option for students to either use a webcam or just use LockDown Browser with an access code/password.
- Take the exam with live proctoring at the [University Testing Center \(UTC\)](#). To implement this approach, the instructor must use Canvas to deliver the exam, as UTC desktops do not have webcams and therefore cannot use Monitor.
- Take the exam in Canvas while a GTA proctor and the student use a [Teams](#) meeting, with a webcam, to monitor the student. To implement this approach, the instructor would create an exam with a [unique password](#) (in a Canvas quiz, scroll to "Require Student Access Codes") that the TA or proctor would give the student at the time the exam is launched.
